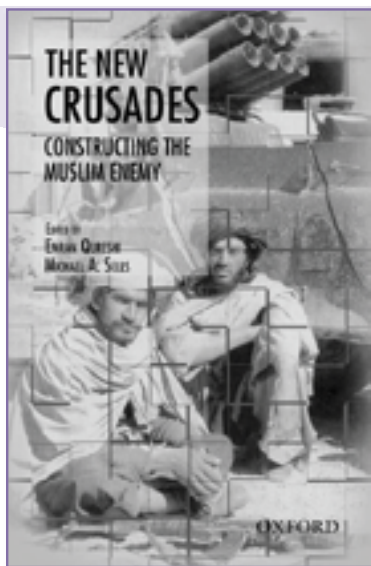
Jihad, Hindutva and the Taliban

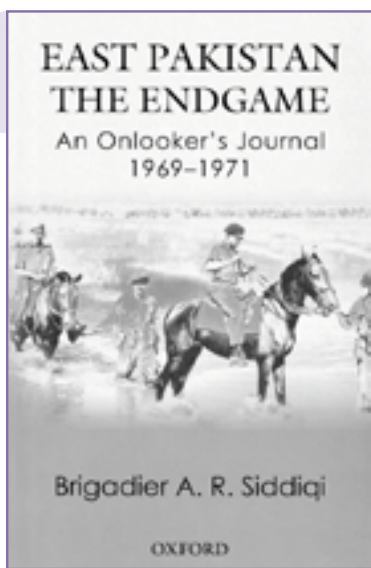

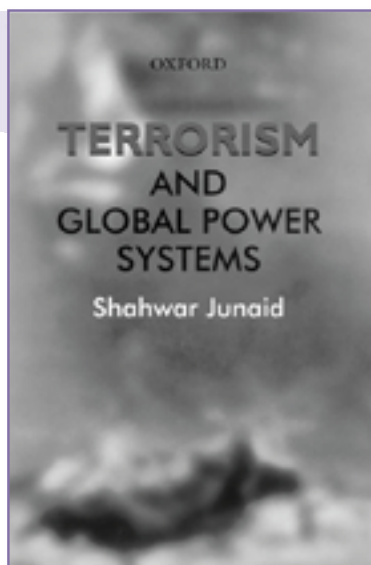
East Pakistan: The Endgame

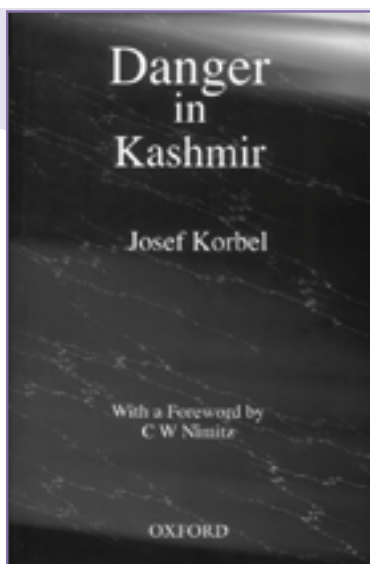

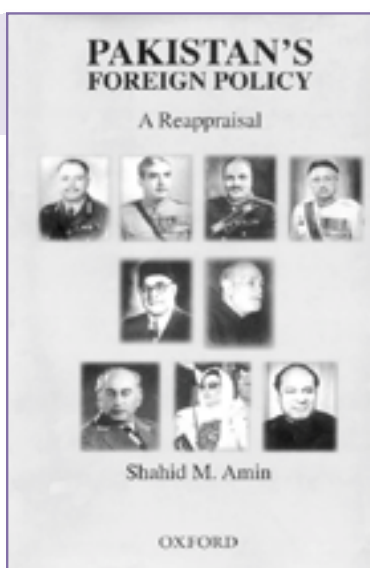
Danger in Kashmir
